



Forza Soccer Academy: Reporting Inappropriate Conduct

At Forza Soccer Academy, the safety and well-being of all children in our care is our top priority. We are committed to maintaining a safe and respectful environment for everyone involved in our programs. To achieve this, we have strict reporting requirements in place to address any concerns regarding inappropriate conduct or suspected child sexual abuse. This document outlines the procedures for reporting such incidents.

Reporting Requirements

All Forza Soccer Academy staff, volunteers, and parents are obligated to report any suspected child sexual abuse, inappropriate behavior, or incidents they become aware of, whether personally witnessed or not.

Where to Report:

1. Allegations or suspicions of potentially illegal behavior (e.g., child sexual abuse) witnessed first-hand:

- You must promptly report such incidents to the police and/or child welfare authorities. Your immediate action is essential to protect the child involved.

2. Allegations or suspicions of potentially illegal behavior learned of but not witnessed first-hand:

- You must promptly report such incidents to the police and/or child welfare authorities. The safety of the child takes precedence, and these matters must be brought to the attention of the appropriate authorities for investigation.

3. Allegations or suspicions of inappropriate behavior (e.g., as described in the examples below) witnessed or learned of:

- These incidents must be reported to the Technical Director, Issa Dawoud (info@forzasocceracademy.ca), who is responsible for handling such cases within our organization.

Examples of Inappropriate Behavior:

- Potentially illegal behavior by a staff member or volunteer of the organization.
- Potentially illegal behavior by a third party, such as a parent, teacher, babysitter, or coach.

Note:

If you are uncertain whether the behavior you have witnessed or heard about involves potentially illegal or inappropriate conduct, please discuss the matter with the designated person within our organization who will provide support and guidance throughout the reporting process. Remember, you have an independent duty to report all suspicions of potentially illegal behavior directly to the police and/or child welfare authorities.

At Forza Soccer Academy, we take all reports of inappropriate conduct seriously and will handle them with utmost care and confidentiality. Our goal is to maintain a safe and secure environment where all children can thrive and enjoy their soccer experience without any concerns for their well-being.
